Australia Awards Scholarships in Mongolia

Australia Awards are prestigious international scholarships offering the next generation of global leaders an opportunity to undertake study, research and professional development in Australia.

Through study and research, recipients develop skills and knowledge to drive change and help build enduring people-to-people links with Australia.

Applicants will be assessed on their professional and personal leadership qualities, academic competence and, most importantly, their potential to impact on development challenges in Mongolia.

Applications are strongly encouraged from women, people with disabilities and other marginalised groups.

Level of study

Australia Awards Scholarships provide citizens of Mongolia with the opportunity to obtain a master's degree qualification at an Australian tertiary institution.

Awards will be offered for commencement in 2020 in two categories:

Category 1: Employees in central and local governments; public universities, hospitals and schools and state-owned enterprises. This Category receives 55 per cent of scholarships.

Category 2: Employees in the private sector, civil society and non-government organisations, private health and educational institutions and country-based offices of international organisations. This Category receives 45 per cent of scholarships.

Awards will be offered to study Masters by Coursework and Masters by Research.

Australia Awards benefits

Australia Awards Scholarships are offered for the period necessary for an individual to complete the program offered by an Australian university, including any preparatory training.

Scholarship recipients will generally receive the following:

- return air travel
- a one-off establishment allowance on arrival
- full tuition fees
- contribution to living expenses
- Introductory Academic Program
- Overseas Student Health Cover for the duration of the Scholarship
- supplementary academic support
- fieldwork allowance (for research students only).

Eligibility criteria

Australia Awards applicants must meet all general eligibility requirements detailed in the *Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook*, available at: <http://dfat.gov.au/about-us/publications/pages/australia-awards-scholarships-policy-handbook.aspx>

Country-specific conditions

In addition, candidates must also meet the following country-specific criteria:

- Applicants require a Bachelor's degree from a university of Mongolia and other countries that must be recognised by Australian universities.
- Applicants working and living in Ulaanbaatar require an IELTS (Academic) overall score of at least 5.5 (or equivalent TOEFL) with no band score less than 5.0, valid at 1 January 2020.
- Applicants working and living in rural areas require an IELTS (Academic) overall score of at least 5.0 (or equivalent TOEFL) with at least Reading and Writing band scores no less than 5.0, valid at 1 January 2020.
- Applicants with identified and verified disabilities require an IELTS (Academic) overall score of at least 5.0 (or equivalent TOEFL) with Reading and Writing band scores no less than 5.0, valid at 1 January 2020.
- Category 1 applicants are required to have worked in the public sector continuously for two-years, however applicants with an identified and verified disability do not need to demonstrate two years' continuous employment
- Category 2 applicants are required to have worked for two years prior to 1 February 2019, however are not required to demonstrate continuous employment and applicants with an identified and verified disability do not need to demonstrate two years' employment.

Note: IELTS and TOEFL certificates are valid for two years. Therefore, they must be dated no earlier than 1 January 2018.

Note: Only Academic IELTS scores are accepted for Australia Awards. General IELTS tests will not be accepted.

Note: Only paper-based and internet-based Official TOEFL tests are accepted for Australia Awards. Institutional TOEFL scores are not accepted.

Note: Applicants with a Master's qualification from a non-Mongolian institution cannot apply for an Australia Award Scholarship in the same field.

Special conditions

Applicants must provide all required information as requested in the application form. False information or not disclosing relevant information in the application could be considered fraud.

Application dates

For study commencing in Australia in 2020

Opening date: 1 February 2019

Closing date: 30 April 2019 (11.59pm AEST)

Applications or supporting documents received after this date will not be considered.

The application process

Online applications

All applications must be lodged online through: <https://oasis.dfat.gov.au/>

Applicants are required to apply on-line before the closing date. The on-line application facility (OASIS) experiences peak use in the days leading up to the closing date and applicants may experience delays.

Hardcopy applications

Applicants from rural or remote areas who do not have internet access must contact the Australia Awards Mongolia office on (11 318852) as soon as possible to discuss options to lodge applications.

Supporting documents

Applicants must submit all the relevant supporting documents listed in the *Australia Awards Scholarships Policy Handbook*.

Applicants must also provide the following documents to meet the specific requirements for Mongolia.

The selection process

Validation checks

Each application is checked against the eligibility criteria, to ensure all required documents are attached, notarized (as required) and valid and that selected courses are within approved fields of study and specialisations.

Technical assessment

Eligible applications are independently assessed, ranked and returned to the Australia Awards Mongolia office.

Short-listing

Short-listing is managed by a panel of representatives from Australia and Mongolia. Successful candidates will demonstrate exceptional academic competence, leadership attributes and realistic development outcomes for Mongolia, meeting the Mongolian and Australian government's priorities.

Interview recommendation

All short-listed applicants are interviewed. A selection panel recommends candidates who best meet the selection criteria and demonstrate realistic ideas to contribute to development in Mongolia.

The number of candidates recommended depends on the quality of candidates and the number of Australia Awards available in Mongolia. The Government of Australia approves candidates to be offered Australia Awards.

Australia Award offer

Before candidates are offered Australia Awards, they must have confirmed places at universities in Australia and meet all visa requirements (including health requirements).

Preparatory training

Awardees must meet English language requirements for acceptance into courses in Australian universities. Awardees selected with an Academic IELTS score of less than 6.5 (or Official TOEFL equivalent) complete an English language training program of up to 26 weeks in Mongolia. This program is compulsory and candidates must be released from work to attend.

Awardees with an Academic IELTS score of at least 6.5 (with no band score less than 6.0) complete an Academic Preparation program in Mongolia before mobilisation.

Awardees must attend a pre-departure briefing before mobilisation.

Outcomes

Applicants will be informed at each stage in the selection process if their application is not proceeding further.

Candidates who are interviewed will be notified of the outcome as soon as possible after selection processes finish in July 2019.
